



We are excited to continue to grow our high school program by offering a la carte high school classes for this upcoming 2026-2027 school year.

CLASSES:

We are currently offering **four classes designed to meet 9th-grade credit requirements and four classes aligned with 10th-grade credits** for the 2026–2027 school year. Older students who need these credits are also welcome to apply. We hope to add additional classes to our 26’-27’ schedule as the Lord provides more teachers.

Classes meet **two days each week**—one hour on Tuesday and one hour on Thursday. Attendance is required on both days, as instruction builds across the week.

As a credit-bearing program, students should expect a **meaningful homework load. All assigned coursework is required** and must be completed in order to earn high school credit.

These courses are designed to meet high school standards and to support students in developing strong academic habits, responsibility, and independence.

PARENT RESPONSIBILITIES:

3:17 Hybrid **partners** with families in the homeschool journey. While teachers will grade most of the coursework, parents may be required to grade some work. Parents are responsible for maintaining official grades and academic records.

Families must remain enrolled with a homeschool oversight organization and are fully responsible for meeting state homeschooling requirements.

2026-2027 COURSE OFFERINGS:

*English and History courses may be taken independently and in any order.

World History (1 credit)- Teacher Mrs. Ellison

Notgrass World History guides students through the story of humanity from ancient civilizations to the modern era, viewing history through a biblical worldview. This course integrates primary sources, literature, and geography to help students understand how ideas, events, and cultures have shaped the world. Students are encouraged to think critically, recognize God’s hand in history, and grow in wisdom and discernment as they study the past.

American History (1 credit)- Teacher: Mrs. Ellison

Notgrass American History explores the story of the United States from early exploration to the present, highlighting key events, leaders, and ideas that shaped the nation. Presented through a biblical worldview, the course weaves together history, geography, and original documents to help students understand America's heritage. Students are encouraged to think critically about freedom, responsibility, and God's purpose throughout our nation's story

English 1 (1 credit)- Teacher: Mrs. Taylor

This course pairs naturally with *Exploring World History* and explores complementary texts and time periods. Students will deepen their understanding of literature and history while strengthening critical thinking, reading, writing, and analytical skills.

English 2 (1 credit)- Teacher: Mrs. Taylor

Designed to pair with *Exploring America*, this course examines letters, speeches, short stories, poetry, and novels alongside key historical events, helping students make meaningful connections between America's past and present. Students will deepen their understanding of literature and history while strengthening critical thinking, reading, writing, and analytical skills.

World Geography (1 credit)- Teacher: Mrs. Ellison

Notgrass World Geography introduces students to the people, places, cultures, and physical features of our world through a Christ-centered lens. This engaging course weaves geography with history, worldview, and current events, helping students understand how God's design and humanity's story shape each region. Designed to build global awareness and thoughtful citizenship, it encourages students to see the world with wisdom, curiosity, and compassion.

Finance (.5 credit)- Teacher: Mrs. Ellison

Foundations in Personal Finance, 4th Edition by Dave Ramsey This project based learning course, designed for homeschool students, presents the life skills every person needs to be equipped in the skills of personal finance, career readiness and entrepreneurship based on the stewardship principle in scripture using the *The Foundations in Personal Finance* by Dave Ramsey as the primary source and another book apx. 200 or less pages as the secondary resource.

Career Exploration (.5 credit)- Teacher: Mrs. Ellison

In this course we will use varying leadership books (awaiting Board approval). This project-based learning course, designed for homeschool students, presents the opportunity to explore individuals' gifts, talents and skills in the context of considering future career choices and paths to accomplish those careers. This class will provide the students with career preparation, career exploration and career assessments (which may require an additional fee) to help discern at least 2 possible careers of interest for their future with a strong knowledge base of those options. Public Speaking and presenting materials/projects, mock interviews, interviewing external leaders in career fields is required in this class.

Spanish 1 (1 credit)- Teacher: Mrs. McCandless

This entry-level course introduces students to foundational communication skills through topics such as greetings, basic conversations, family, food, numbers, and everyday vocabulary, while developing listening, speaking, reading, and writing abilities. Students will also explore Hispanic culture by examining traditions, geography, and daily life in several Spanish-speaking countries around the world, fostering both cultural awareness and global understanding.
