

We are excited to offer high school classes for this upcoming 2025-2026 school year! We ask you to pray with us for God's direction over these plans as we finalize details. We still need a science and electives teacher, so please help us spread the word and pray for God's provision!

CLASSES:

We need a minimum of 4 students enrolled to offer a class. Please help us spread the word about our growing program. (We have met the minimum requirement with most classes. See the schedule at the end of this document for specifics.)

We will offer five classes geared toward 9th-grade credit requirements, but older students who need these credits are welcome to apply.

We are also excited to offer US History, English 2 & Geometry.

Classes will be held two days a week, one hour on Tuesday and one hour on Thursday, with attendance mandatory on both days.

Expect considerable homework, as high school classes will be meant to fulfill credit requirements.

PARENT RESPONSIBILITIES:

Teachers will grade all work, but parents will be responsible for keeping all grades and records.

Parents will still need a homeschool oversight organization and will be fully responsible to the state for homeschooling their students.

CURRICULUM:

History- Notgrass Exploring World History & Notgrass Exploring America

English 1- This English 1 course, which will be paired with the Exploring World history class, will explore complementary texts and time periods, deepening students' understanding of both literature and history. By studying related historical events and literary works, students will strengthen critical thinking, reading, writing, and analysis skills, as well as make connections between the past and present. (English and History classes can be taken independently)

English 2- English 2, paired with the Exploring America history class, will examine literature and historical events from overlapping periods, enhancing students' understanding of both subjects. This approach allows students to strengthen their analytical, writing, and reading skills while making connections between historical contexts and literary works for a deeper, more engaging learning experience. (English and History classes can be taken independently)

Math- Christian Light Algebra 1 & Christian Light Geometry

TUITION	TWO DAYS- Tuesday and Thursday	
Application	\$30 per student	
	*returning students' fee is waived	
Enrollment	\$100 per student	
Tuition	\$425 per class- Classes will be a la carte—meaning students pay per class and may choose one, some, or all classes. Classes will be one hour on Tuesday and one hour on Thursday.	
Honors Option	\$65 per class- An honors option will be available to add to each class for students who want that option.	
Lab Fees	\$75 per class requiring a lab	
Study Hall	\$200 per study hour- A study hall will be available for students who would like to remain on campus if there is a gap in their class schedule.	
Books	Parents are responsible for purchasing all required books for each class.	

Guidance Counselor	Fee to be paid directory to guidance counselors- We recommend Jennifer Lanier, a founding Board Member, as a personal guidance counselor for consultations to assist parents in preparing their students for graduation and beyond. (She is available for guidance counseling starting June 1- contact information in the below website link).
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PAYMENT OPTIONS:

Tuition payments will be processed using FACTS Tuition Management Company. The Director will send information about applying to FACTS. There are two options for payment using FACTS. There will be a FACTS fee charged per family.

Option 1– Tuition Lump Sum Payment:

Families will pay the tuition in one lump sum due on June 1, 2025. The one-time \$25 FACTS fee charged per family will be waved for families paying in full.

Option 2– Tuition Monthly Payments:

Families may make ten monthly payments to be paid on the first of every month beginning June 1, 2025 and ending on March 1, 2026. There will be a one-time \$55 FACTS fee charged per family paying monthly.

WITHDRAWAL AND REFUNDS

Once your child is enrolled, if you wish to withdraw your child from enrollment at 3:17, please fill out a withdrawal form (ask administration for a copy).

If a child is withdrawn before May 31, 2025, tuition will not be charged.

If a child is withdrawn between June 1 and July 31, 2025, the family will be invoiced and responsible for 50% of the tuition payment.

If a child is withdrawn after August 1, 2025, the family will be invoiced and responsible for 100% of the tuition payment.

No refunds of student tuition (or release from remaining student tuition bills) will be given except for the following reasons:

- Death of a parent
- Loss of a job (parent)
- Unexpected and unplanned move out of state

If you are a military family with a probable impending move, please call our Director (803-669-9456) to discuss options prior to enrolling.
